Commentary

It's been a tough quarter for UK shares. The COVID-19 pandemic saw the UK suffer the worst economic hit of any developed nation, followed by a perfect storm of localised lockdowns and political uncertainty of ongoing Brexit negotiations. On top of that, a large part of the UK market is made up of so-called 'legacy' industries – such as parts of the energy sector – that have been around for a long time and are vulnerable to changes accelerated by the pandemic.

In the US, uncertainty around the presidential elections and a sell-off in technology shares has tempered otherwise good performance. In the Asia region, shares have also performed well: China is on the ascendancy, with rising economic growth levels putting it back on track, and Japanese shares have also had a boost.

Meanwhile, bonds have been fairly flat both domestically and internationally as interest rates remain negative or near-zero.


In the Moderately Adventurous fund, we hold diversified positions. The idea is that when one sector, or region, performs poorly, other areas often move in the opposite direction – which we've seen happen this quarter. Falls in the fund's UK exposures have been offset by its international holdings, leading to a total return of 1.2% over the quarter and a 12month return of 0.1%.


